Since the New Year of 2024 rolled in on Epiphany Sunday, January 7th, our worship series entitled *Momentum for Life: D.R.I.V.E* has been inviting us into reflection as we look at our individual forward movement in faith and life. I have personally felt that momentum in life and faith should never pause. For everything our God created has forward movement. Maintaining life-momentum is imperative if we are going to navigate our way faithfully through our relationships, our work and interests, and our health. Visualizing our future is necessary to a momentum of growth and devotion to God and the life God calls us to live as disciples.

"We are all people of influence. Each of us has an effect on those in our circles of acquaintances, friends, and family. Influence is most often about our actions more than our words. And we dream about the incredible opportunities we have to influence the world for God's purposes. We know through God's Spirit we can make a lasting contribution that benefits the well-being of others. But having a dream and having the disciplined, lifelong dedication to realize that dream are two different things. Most good things are the result of predetermined desires and an ongoing commitment to build momentum for life." Faith and things worthwhile are not quickly acquired, they are an ongoing result of continual forward motion. People often dream of walking closely with God and making a difference in the world. Yet, we often compromise those idealistic visions by life distractions instead of dedication, money instead of meaning, jobs instead of enduring contributions. God wants so much more. God wants to build lifelong momentum...YES, even in this stage and season of our lives...YES, at our age. God does not want to see us plateau or retire from continued forward movement in our faith, our relationships, our influences, our work, our interests, our health, our vision for our future. Thus, why I chose for us to begin this year with: Momentum for Life: D.R.I.V.E. As Rev. Michael Slaughter shares, "Every follower of Christ needs self-management practices that create momentum for life in the elements of **D**evotion to God, **R**eadiness for Life Long Learning, **I**nvesting in Key Relationships, **V**isioning the Future, and Eating and Exercising." Faithful discipleship includes God's vision for all these areas moving forward in each of our lives with intentionality.

I hope you will join me as we explore the **V** in our model for living; D.R.I.V.E. **V**=**Vision for the future.** This is the most critical discipline. It is critical for us to have a vision because as Jeremiah 1:11-13 reminds us, it is important to see and develop the life picture God has given us – our unique calling to become who God has created us to be and dreams for us as individuals as well as a church.
