Devotion: reflects our ultimate values.

reveals true belief.

Passion: is a motivator

and determines your life actions and directions.

1. What do those who know you best say that your passions are?

(Suggest: ask three people and reflect on their responses)

2. Does your belief in God need to grow OR...

Does your passion for God need to grow in order to give you momentum to thrive in the face of resistance?

Present to God's Presence: God is always speaking but are we listening? Devotion is time focused on God's presence

1. What helps you to focus on God?

Passionate Life Focus: Being fully present to God's presence continually renews a healthy, passionate life focus.

1. Psalm 121 says, "Where does my help come" – my help refers to my meaning, my purpose, and my life-empowerment.

So, when you lift your eyes to the mountains, what "gods" offer you relief in times of stress?

Danger Zones: Passions that take on a life of their own.

1. What could be your danger zone?

"God is looking for people who will take their lives out of park and
shift them into drive." How does this statement apply to your
devotion to God? What is one thing God might be saying to you?
What action plan might you make to give you momentum for
bringing more balance in this area of your life?





SCRIPTURE AS ART RETURNS JANUARY 21, 1 P.M.

This is a ministry to participate in a lowstructure exploration of scripture. It is a way to allow your creativity and imagination emerge as you reflect on a particular

scripture. Need to be an artist? – NO! Just be open to the movement of the Spirit. **This is how it works:**

- First think of "art" in broad terms...poetry, coloring, painting, sculpting, weaving, song, dance, and acting.
- 2. Read the scripture I am naming over the next two weeks. As you read it, pay attention to what calls upon your imagination. Read or listen to the scripture with senses alert. What colors do you picture would be a part of a painting as your expression. What words or emotions stand out to you? What music style and lyrics might sing forth within you? On what aspect of the story does your heart focus?
- 3. Share your feelings and thoughts in some artistic representation. No talent and skill is judged. It is simple to draw deeper into God's word in a different way and allow God to speak to us through our senses. Allow it to become an act of prayer and/or praise.
- 4. Invite other friends and family to join you or do something themselves this is a great intergenerational activity.
- 5. On the date named, we will share our artistic expression with others online.

Scripture Focus: Luke 5:17-25 (Common English Bible)

17 One day when Jesus was teaching, Pharisees and legal experts were sitting nearby. They had come from every village in Galilee and Judea, and from Jerusalem. Now the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal. 18 Some men were bringing a man who was paralyzed, lying on a cot. They wanted to carry him in and place him before Jesus, 19 but they couldn't reach him because of the crowd. So they took him up on the roof and lowered him—cot and all—through the roof tiles into the crowded room in front of Jesus. 20 When Jesus saw their faith, he said, "Friend, your sins are forgiven." 21 The legal experts and Pharisees began to mutter among themselves, "Who is this who insults God? Only God can forgive sins!"

²² Jesus recognized what they were discussing and responded, "Why do you fill your minds with these questions? ²³ Which is easier—to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up and walk'? ²⁴ But so that you will know that the Human One^[0] has authority on the earth to forgive sins" —Jesus now spoke to the man who was paralyzed, "I say to you, get up, take your cot, and go home." ²⁵ Right away, the man stood before them, picked up his cot, and went home, praising God.
