Readiness... "preparation or availability for service, action, or progress. Prompt willingness."

 "We spend more time working than any other single activity", yet God desires our "work" to be fruitful and fulfilling. How would you describe your workday job?

Creative Work: God created us to be creative. Romans 12:1-2

• How might you release creativity in your life?

Flexible Minds: The Bible challenges us to pursue wisdom.

• Matt. 9:17 tells us "you can't put new wine in old wineskins," because they have lost the ability to stretch. What obstacles are keeping you from stretching and forward movement?
